On this 15th anniversary of the 9/11 attacks, our Lord reminds us he is the Prince of Peace. Let us strive for peace in our homes, our community and this church. Welcome! If you are a visitor, please sign the guest register at the rear of the sanctuary and please join us for worship again. We have a transport chair available to members and guests when needed. This festival, which originated in the fourth century, celebrates the triumph of the cross. Paul reminds us that Christ crucified is the power and wisdom of God. As Moses put a serpent on a pole to be a source of healing for the Israelites, we lift high the cross as the sign of our health and salvation. Each time we make the sign of the cross we remember our baptism into the death and resurrection of Christ.

As Lutherans, we believe that the bread and wine of Holy Communion are signs given by God that Christ is fully present among us. We invite you to participate in receiving this miraculous presence. If you are unable to receive either the bread or the wine, be assured that even in the words, Christ is present to you. You are welcome to come to the Table to be fed and nurtured with us.

WORD

FIRST READING: Numbers 21:4b-9

When the people spoke against God and Moses, the Lord sent poisonous snakes against them. Moses interceded for the people, and the Lord ordered him to erect a serpent of bronze on a pole. All who looked at it after having been bitten by a serpent would live.

L A reading from Numbers.

[From Mount Horeb the Israelites set out,]^{4b} but the people became impatient on the way.⁵ The people spoke against God and against Moses, "Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? For there is no food and no water, and we detest this miserable food."⁶ Then the LORD sent poisonous serpents among the people, and they bit the people, so that many Israelites died.⁷ The people came to Moses and said, "We have sinned by speaking against the LORD and against you; pray to the LORD to take away the serpents from us." So Moses prayed for the people.⁸ And the LORD said to Moses, "Make a poisonous serpent, and set it on a pole; and everyone who is bitten shall look at it and live."⁹ So Moses made a serpent of bronze, and put it upon a pole; and whenever a serpent bit someone, that person would look at the serpent of bronze and live.





CCL--SIX YEARS OF MINISTRY



September is the month Creative Christian Ladies, a Rouzerville community group, begins its SEVENTH year of crocheting, knitting, or working hand-held looms to make beautiful yarn creations that are freely given to adults and children here in our local area as well as around

the world. This service group began in September 2010. The ladies meet most Wednesday evenings September through May. Sometimes during the summer, the group gets together for a field trip to a yarn shop somewhere not too far away. This past May we went to The Knitting Cottage on Iron Bridges Road. The yarns were beautiful—the cookies delicious. From there, we went to Antietam Dairy for ice cream and conversation.

In the past, created items have been given to Appalachia Women's Alliance in Clinchco, Virginia; Pennsylvania World Vision; Samaritans Purse; Lutheran Social Services; Waynesboro and Chambersburg hospitals; a cancer center; nursing homes; Pregnancy Ministries in Waynesboro; Our Savior's Lutheran Church in Box Elder, Montana; and individuals in our local area.

During our six years of service, we have created around 640 hats, over 44 sweaters, over 60 lap robes, over 70 prayer shawls, and around 60 baby blankets.

As you look around the church today, you see our many beautiful creations made during our SIXTH year. You'll find 124 hats for babies through adults, 23 lap robes and shawls, 7 children's sweaters, and 18 baby blankets. From now through October they will be given to agencies near and far.

New members are welcome all year long, even if you don't know how to knit or crochet. Someone is always willing to help you learn. Join us in ministry and fellowship in the Social Room of Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church in Rouzerville most Wednesdays from 7 to 8:30 p.m. from September through May.
